



## Daphne Jackson Fellowship Opportunity at Birkbeck, University of London

Applications are invited for two, three year part-time (0.5 FTE) Daphne Jackson Fellowships at Birkbeck, University of London. The Fellowship is intended for individuals returning to research in Psychological Sciences.

The Department of Psychological Sciences is a vibrant, world-leading centre of innovative psychological research and training. This research-intensive Department which came 5<sup>th</sup> in the UK in the RAE2008 and RAE2014 is home to centres, labs and facilities that support ground-breaking work in diverse areas of psychological investigation. Applications are invited from candidates with specialist interests in the core research areas supported by the Department, including: genetics, perception, cognitive neuroscience, cognitive evolution, cognitive development (neurotypical and non-neurotypical), health psychology and computational modelling. Evidence of an established or developing track record in research, including quality journal publications, is essential. Fellowships will be primarily research-based, but successful candidates will also make a contribution to teaching in an area of Psychology that provides synergy with existing activities within the Department and supervise BSc and MSc Psychology dissertations with administrative roles as appropriate.

Birkbeck, University of London will host and half sponsor the Fellowships. The remaining funding will be secured by the Daphne Jackson Trust from an additional sponsor.
