



## 2 x Daphne Jackson Fellowship Opportunities at Queen Mary University of London

Applications are invited for 2 x three-year part-time (0.5FTE) Daphne Jackson Fellowships to be hosted and sponsored by The Faculty of Medicine and Dentistry, Queen Mary University of London. The two Fellowships are intended for individuals returning to research within the Faculty of Medicine and Dentistry's strategic research areas.

Queen Mary University of London is one of the UK's leading research-focused higher education institutions, a member of the elite Russell Group of UK universities, and ranked 3<sup>nd</sup> in London for Medicine and 1<sup>st</sup> in London for Dentistry by the 2023 Guardian University Guide and the 2022 National Student Survey (NSS).

The Faculty of Medicine and Dentistry (FMD) is a highly successful Faculty at Queen Mary University of London. FMD has a research spend of circa £100m and a research portfolio that spans from discovery and applied science, through translational research and applied health research.

Our research is embedded within the local community of East London and supports the Faculty's objective to produce innovative therapies and advance patient management nationally and internationally. The impact of our research is far-reaching, with extensive partnerships across the globe to facilitate large-scale projects. We were recently rated as being in the top 15 in the world for citations in Medicine & Dentistry (QS World Rankings 2023) and our researchers are recognised internationally as leaders in their respective fields. FMD also runs a highly regarded portfolio of undergraduate and postgraduate education. It has over 4,700 students spread across all our campuses, including Malta.

Most of our research activities take place within the five of the six institutes that comprise the Faculty of Medicine and Dentistry (FMD):

- The Barts Cancer Institute, led by Professor Nick Lemoine, focuses on cutting edge molecular and translational cancer research.
- The Blizard Institute, led by Professor Mary Collins, focuses on cell biology, genomics, immunology, neuroscience, and trauma sciences.
- The William Harvey Research Institute (WHRI), led by Professor Panos Deloukas, undertakes cardiovascular, inflammation and endocrine research leading to therapeutic innovation.
- The Wolfson Institute of Population Health Sciences, led by Professor Fiona Walters, focuses on Preventive Medicine, Epidemiology, Psychiatry, Clinical Trials Methodology and Statistics, Global Public Health, Primary Care, Mental Health, and Women's Health.
- The Institute of Dentistry, led by Professor Paul Coulthard, focuses on clinical, epidemiological and public health research in dentistry with a solid basic science research base.
- The Institute of Health Sciences Education, led by Professor Arunthathi Mahendran, focuses primarily on medical education and pedagogical research within the fields of health and medical education.

## **Benefits**

We offer competitive salaries, access to a generous pension scheme, 30 days' leave per annum (pro-rata for part-time/fixed-term), a season ticket loan scheme and access to a comprehensive range of personal and professional development opportunities. In addition, we offer a range of work-life balance and family-friendly inclusive employment policies, flexible working arrangements, and campus facilities including an on-site nursery at the Mile End campus.

The post will be based at one of our three Faculty campuses in London. It is a part-time, fixed-term appointment for 3 years. The starting salary will be Grade 5 and £47,178 per annum (pro-rata), inclusive of London Allowance.
