## **Daphne Jackson Fellowships with Cancer Research UK**

Applications are invited for up to three Daphne Jackson Fellowships funded by Cancer Research UK to be held at the CRUK Scotland Institute, Glasgow. The part-time fellowships are open to individuals who want to return to research after a career break of at least two years to carry out research focused on understanding the mechanisms that regulate cancer cell proliferation, survival and dissemination. Applicants from a range of disciplines are welcome to apply, for example including computational as well as biomedical scientists.
